<p>Medical Clearance Guidelines</p>	<p>Please help us serve your patients more efficiently by checking the following appropriate admissions: Patient is alert and oriented X3, can be easily awakened and can participate in an assessment Patient can perform own activities of daily living Vital signs are stable Blood Alcohol Levels show a downward trend from the time the patient presented to your ER Comorbid medical conditions are stable (e.g. no tube feeding required, no IV or IV ports) Comorbid psychiatric conditions are stable (e.g. no suicidal/homicidal ideation, no combative behavior, no chemical restraints) Psychotropic medications are within therapeutic range (e.g. Depakote, Lithium) and/or don't require close monitoring (except for detoxification medications)</p>
